Who can submit events and resource content for assessment and review?

- Members of the public with lived experience of stroke usually but not necessarily living within the Champlain region
- Stroke healthcare providers within Champlain.
- Members of established not for profit stroke care organizations such as March of Dimes, Heart & Stroke Foundation, Ontario Caregiver Association, Ontario Brain Injury Association, University of Ottawa Heartwise program, other regional Stroke networks in Ontario.

The Network will review and approve any events from organizations not listed above.

What kind of events and resources can be posted?

- Information based on Canadian Stroke Best Practice recommendations and evidence-based, provided by established partners in stroke care.
- Peer support and personal stroke journey stories are presented under the guidance of a moderator from a trusted stroke care organization.
- Events should be free of charge or not for-profit.
- No personal bias or opinion in the content should be evident.
- Speakers/presenters should attempt to provide information in plain language without acronyms and technical terms unless providing a full explanation of meaning.
- The location or online connection must be accessible to stroke survivors.
- Privacy of attendees must be protected unless prior approval has been granted.

What cannot be posted?

Research projects and recruitment associated with research activities are not permitted.
