

How will I be contacted?

Within one to four days of your hospital discharge, you (or your primary contact person, if specified) will be called by a team member from Ontario Health atHome to complete an assessment.



To qualify for stroke rehabilitation programs, patients must:

- Be living in a home or retirement home,
- Have had a recent stroke (within six months),
- Be willing and able to take part in an intensive therapy program,
- Be able to follow instructions from a therapist,
- Have a caregiver to attend therapy with if help from two people is needed to get in and out of a chair.

- **Patients who would do well in their home setting** may participate in the Community Stroke Rehabilitation Program offered by Ontario Health atHome, or may be referred to another appropriate community service that best fits their needs.
